

**HOW TO REGISTER TO VOTE**

- Mail-in Registration Forms can be obtained from the county clerk's office, in some phone books (last page of the blue government section) or at the Orem City Recorder's office at 56 N. State, Suite 200.
- At the county clerk's office (100 East Center Street--Provo). County webpage - You can print out a voter registration form at the Utah County webpage at <http://elections.utah.gov/VoterRegistrationForm.pdf> (You will need to mail or deliver a paper copy as well.)

To see if you are correctly registered, you can call Utah County at 801.851.8127 or check the statewide voter registration database at <http://gva1.utah.gov/elections/polling.aspx>.

Voting Absentee – This is a two-step process that begins with you filling out an application form. You can download it at <http://www.orem.org/PDF/RO/Application%20for%20Absent%20Voter.pdf> or you can call the Orem City Recorder's office to have an application mailed to you. Once you have returned the application to the Recorder's Office you will be mailed a ballot.

**EARLY VOTING** – Begins two weeks before the election and will be conducted at the City Recorder's Office.

- Primary—September 1-11, 2009
- General – October 20-30, 2009

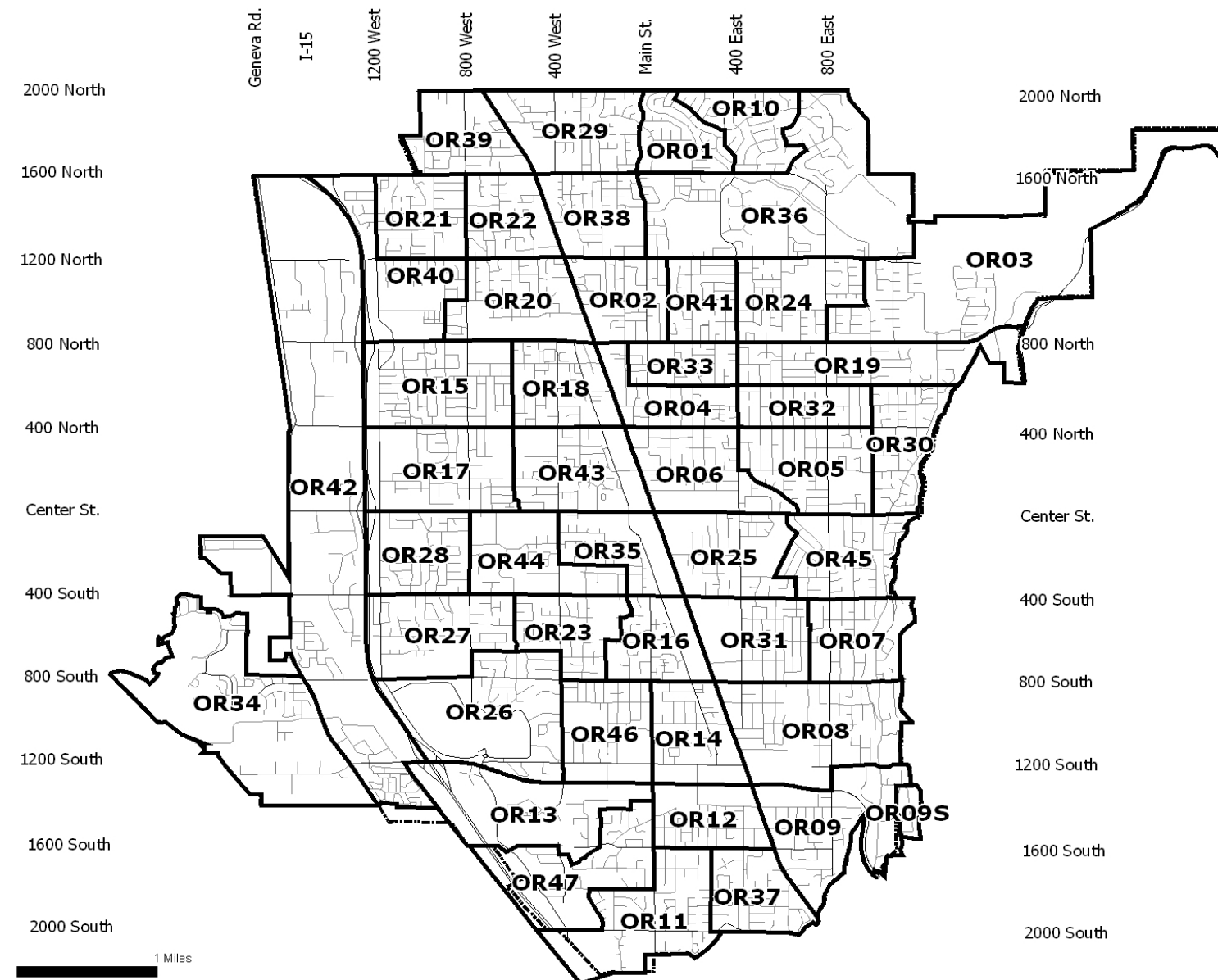
