

Orem Neighborhood Plans Goals

Public Works

- Increase the coordination between the Neighborhood residents and Public Works department.
- Monitor water usage on public properties and adjust as needed.
- Improve the lighting around parks, trails, and other recreational amenities.
- Seek community volunteer opportunities to assist public works in improving the neighborhood.
- Continual maintenance of existing public services
- Increased coordination between the Neighborhoods and Public Works
- Increase the coordination between the Neighborhood residents and Public Works department.
- Seek community volunteer opportunities to assist public works in improving the neighborhood.
- Provide street lighting and safe crossings for all bike and walking paths; improve ADA access.
- Increase / improve parks & open space in all areas.
- Consider pocket parks where possible.
- Better maintenance of existing amenities.
- More park programming, events, activities
- Activities should be inclusive for all types of families and for both apartments and single-family neighborhoods
- Activities and parks should be inclusive of those who have disabilities
- Consider community gardens
- Increase the coordination between the neighborhood residents and the public works department through communication and outreach.
- Apply the use of newer technology to increase the efficiency and conservation of water and other public works services.
- Better manage water use at parks and on public property to avoid wasting water and leaving greenspaces soaked and muddy.
- Increase / improve parks and open space in all areas.
- Increase the number of community gardens, replacing vacant or underutilized greenspace where possible.
- Provide a city sponsored farmers market that is larger scale and regularly scheduled for the spring, summer, and fall.
- Maintain current landmarks, such as parks and historical markers, and preserve other areas where applicable to encourage city beautification.
- Ensure that all city properties are adequately landscaped and maintained.
- Improve sidewalks and pedestrian crossings at 300 West and 800 South.
- Continue to implement newer technology, such as water-wise irrigation controllers, soil-moisture based technologies, and central control systems, to conserve irrigation water on city property.
- Continue to promote public safety and walkability with prompt snow removal, sidewalk repairs, and bike lane improvements.
- Maintain transparency with the public about current and future projects as well as with changes to the public utilities fee rate system.
- Encourage the preservation of a certain percentage of open space with new development.

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- Encourage park programming of events and activities, such as yoga classes, farmers' markets, and puppet shows, that do not cause high noise disturbance for nearby neighbors.
- Improve maintenance of existing parks, trails, and other amenities, such as the Hillcrest Tennis Courts and Hillcrest Park.
- Support the City's efforts to acquire new properties, such as the Hillcrest Elementary property, where possible, and develop into public parks and open spaces.
- Incentivize the use of newer technology, such as water-wise irrigation controllers, soil-moisture based technologies, and central control systems, to conserve water.
- Improve pedestrian crossings at the junctions of 400 South and 800 South on 800 East and look into the possibility of installing a high-intensity activated cross walk beacon.
- Support a new stoplight at 1200 West and 600 South
- Evaluate the installation of a crosswalk at 600 West 800 South
- Install sidewalk on 400 South from 1200 West to Geneva
- Explore parking enforcement underneath Freeway (parking trucks, RVs, Trailers)
- Evaluate the Installation of a traffic light at 400 South and 400 West
- Work with UVU on parking ideas/ incentives for students to ride more transit
- Encourage more regular meetings with UVU/City/Neighborhood
- Support composting in the neighborhood, and a partnership with the City
- Encourage dark skies plan with city lighting in neighborhoods at with UVU
- Support efforts for future bike/pedestrian plan update
- Encourage stronger water conservation efforts by improving landscaping requirement further than 50% green requirement
- Consider protected bike lanes on 400 South.
- Encourage more scooters in the city
- Support the installation of more parking for students on the west side of I-15 near FrontRunner station?
- Support regulations for water conservation measures for carwashes.
- Support focused effort to keep bike lanes on Geneva Road cleared and clean
- Supports efforts to keep sidewalks from being overgrown by weeds.
- Explore new park areas, and provide green space for High Density Areas such as Lake Ridge Condos.
- Support City endeavor to create Southwest Annexation area trail network.
- Explore the potential of planting more shade trees in Nielsens Grove Park.
- Explore possibility of reflective land tape on Orem City Streets to improve public safety.
- Endeavor to improve air quality through the proper queuing and signal timing at intersections to reduce idling time.
- Explore city park ideas in the Lakeview area as well as pocket park locations on both sides of I-15.
- Explore the idea of a future park designed with more trees to play under, hills and berms for natural play spaces, and provide shade for play equipment to prevent burns from hot play equipment.
- Support the installation and maintenance of street lights, particularly along Geneva road to enhance pedestrian and automotive safety.

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- Support and encourage installation of more public recreation amenities in the neighborhood, such as pickle ball courts.
