Measures Submitted

Constitutional Amendment A

Shall the Utah Constitution be amended to change a provision relating to special sessions of the Utah Legislature that are convened by the president of the Utah Senate and speaker of the Utah House of Representatives:

- to increase the limit on the total amount of money the Legislature may appropriate during the session from an amount equal to 1% of the total amount appropriated during the preceding fiscal year to an amount equal to 5% of the total amount appropriated during the preceding fiscal year; and
- to exclude from that 5% limit:
 - an appropriation of money that the state receives from the federal government to address a fiscal, public health, or other emergency or crisis; and
 - an appropriation that decreases the amount of money previously authorized to be spent.

Board of Education of Alpine School District Bond Election

Shall the Board of Education (the "Board") of Alpine School District, Utah (the "District"), be authorized to issue General Obligation Bonds (the "Bonds") in a principal amount not to exceed Five Hundred Ninety Five Million Dollars (\$595,000,000) for the purpose of paying all or a portion of the costs to acquire land; acquiring, constructing, furnishing and equipping new school facilities; improving or rebuilding existing facilities; and the authorization and issuance of the Bonds due and payable with a term not to exceed twenty (20) years from the date or dates of issuance of the Bonds?

Property Tax Cost of Bonds

If the Bonds are issued as planned, without regard to the existing taxes currently paid for existing bonds that will reduce over time, a property tax sufficient to pay debt service on the Bonds will be required over a period of twenty (20) years in the estimated amount of \$210.21 per year on a \$500,000 primary residence and in the estimated amount of \$382.20 per year on a business or secondary residence having the same value.

The District has other outstanding bonds for which a tax decrease would occur upon the retirement of such bonds, which may not occur if the Bonds are issued. However, these outstanding bonds reduce over time such that it is expected that there will be no (\$0.00) incremental property tax increase on residences and businesses within the District from current annual levels after the Bonds are issued.

The foregoing information is only an estimate and is not a limit on the amount of taxes that the District may be required to levy to pay debt service on the Bonds. The District is obligated to levy taxes to the extent provided by law in order to pay the Bonds. The amounts are based on various assumptions and estimates, including estimated debt service on the Bonds and taxable values of property in the District.

Saratoga Springs Bond Election

Shall the City Council (the "City Council") of Saratoga Springs, Utah (the "City"), be authorized to issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed Seventy Million Dollars (\$70,000,000) (the "Bonds") for the purpose of financing all or a portion of the costs of constructing and equipping recreational facilities of every kind allowed by Utah Code § 11-14-103(1)(b)(v) within the City, said Bonds to be due and payable in not to exceed twenty-five (25) years from the date of issuance of the Bonds?

Property Tax Cost of Bonds: If the Bonds are issued as planned (and without regard to the existing taxes currently paid for existing bonds that will reduce over time), a property tax sufficient to pay debt service on the Bonds will be required over a period of twenty-five (25) years in the estimated average amount of \$319.49 per year on a \$528,000 primary residence and in the estimated amount of \$580.90 per year on a business property having the same value.

The foregoing information is only an estimate and is not a limit on the amount of taxes that the City Council may be required to levy to pay debt service on the Bonds. The City Council is obligated to levy taxes to the extent provided by law in order to pay the Bonds. The amounts are based on various assumptions and estimates, including estimated debt service on the Bonds and taxable values of property in the City.
